PARISH REGISTRATION

All families and individuals within the canonical bound areas of St. John the Evangelist are invited to register by contacting the Parish Office.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place on Thursday from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM in the Chapel. You are invited to visit as your schedule permits. If you wish to be a regularly scheduled adorer, please contact the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the First and Third Sunday of the month at 1:30 pm. Baptisms will not be performed during Lent. An instructional Infant Baptism Class is required for parents having their child baptized and is recommended for godparents. For more information and to register for Pre-baptism class, please call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Marriage: Common Policy among the Dioceses in New Jersey recommends preparing for your wedding at least one year in advance. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Saturday from 4:00-4:45 pm in the Reconciliation Room of the Church or by appointment.

Sacrament of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office if you are homebound and would like to receive Holy Communion. In the event of an emergency, please call 732-685-1098, day or night.

Sponsor Eligibility: Godparents/Sponsor eligibility certificates are available for registered parishioners by calling the Parish Office. Godparents/Sponsors must be practicing Catholics who have received the Sacraments of Initiation and, if married, are in a marriage recognized by the Church.

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Whole Community Catechesis is available for registered parish families with children in Grades 1-8. As the Primary Catechists of their children, parents are prepared and supported to lead their children in faith at home. Meetings are twice a month, one for Parents only to prepare for monthly activity lessons and one for parents and children to grow in community. Sacramental reception years (2nd and 8th grade) have additional Sunday meetings to prepare for receiving First Reconciliation/Holy Communion and Confirmation. Learning About the Mass continued...

The Liturgy of the Word –The First Reading
After the Collect we begin the Liturgy of the Word. At Mass, we listen to a reader proclaim the word of God from the Bible. We pay close attention because the Bible isn't just another book. The Scriptures were written by people long ago, but God inspired them. He still uses the Bible to speak his truth to us today. The Bible is God's own speech. When we hear God's Word, understand that He is speaking personally to each one of us.

The Bible is a collection of 73 books written by many authors, but all inspired by God. The Bible is grouped under two headings: The Old Testament and the New Testament. The Old Testament is the history of God's chosen people of Israel from creation to before the time of Jesus Christ. The word Testament also means "covenant" which is a binding agreement. The Old Testament tells how God made a series of covenants or binding agreements with what became the nation of the Jewish people, known as Israel. God promised blessing and membership in His family in return for loving obedience. The New Testament tells how God fulfilled those promises by means of a new covenant in His son Jesus Christ.

The First Reading is usually from the Old Testament, except during Easter, and will normally connect to the Gospel reading of the day in some way.

At the end of the First Reading, we respond "Thanks be to God." Thanksgiving is gratitude to God for his goodness and his acts in history.
