December 12, 2021 3rd Sunday of Advent

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God." (Philippians 4:6)

St. Paul reminds us that God is an abundant God – He is the ultimate giver of gifts. He promises to give us all that we need. Remember, that we are created in God's image and likeness. We, too, are made to be generous with all of our gifts as well. Placing our trust in God frees us from being a slave to possessions. It allows us to gratefully and generously share ourselves and our goods with others.

Whole Community Catechesis



Learning About the Mass continued...

The Second Reading

We learned about the Responsorial Psalm last week. There were 150 psalms written in the Old Testament.

After the Responsorial psalm, we hear the 2nd reading. The 2nd reading comes from the New Testament and while the New Testament is from the time of Jesus' Birth, the 2nd readings cover the time from after Jesus' death and resurrection and describe what happened in the early part of the church.

The 2nd readings include readings from either *The Acts of the Apostles, the Epistles, or the Book of Revelation*.[1]

The Acts of the Apostles describes how Jesus' 12 chosen Apostles spread this new Faith in Jesus under the guidance of the Holy Spirit to not only the Jewish Community but to those outside of the Jewish community, known as the Gentiles.^[2]

The Epistles were letters written to an early church community. Many of the Epistles were written by Saint Paul. St. Paul originally wasn't a saint. He use to persecute the new Christians until one day he had a miraculous conversion after he fell to the ground and heard Jesus speaking to Him. He became blind for three days before regaining his sight. He then became a great leader of the Christian faith. Today's 2nd reading is a letter from Paul to the Philippians. The Epistles were written to teach Christians how to show our love for Jesus in our everyday lives. [3]

The Book of Revelation, which is the last book in the Bible, is an account of the mysterious vision that was given to Saint John -revealing how Christ will Triumph over Satan.

The 2nd reading is often chosen independently of the first reading and the Gospel.


