Sacrament of Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the First and Third Sunday of the month at 1:30 pm. Baptisms will not be performed during Lent. An instructional Infant Baptism Class is required for parents having their child baptized and is recommended for godparents. For more information and to register for Pre-baptism class, please call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Marriage: Common Policy among the Dioceses in New Jersey recommends preparing for your wedding at least one year in advance. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Saturday form 4:00-4:45 pm in the Reconciliation Room of the Church or by appointment.

Sacrament of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office if you are homebound and would like to receive Holy Communion. In the event of an emergency, please call 732-685-1098, day or night.

Sponsor Eligibility: Godparents/Sponsor eligibility certificates are available for registered parishioners by calling the Parish Office. Godparents/Sponsors must be practicing Catholics who have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and, if married, are in a marriage recognized by the Church.

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Whole Community Catechesis is available for registered parish families with children in Grades 1-8. As the Primary Catechists of their children, parents are prepared and supported to lead their children in faith at home. Meetings are twice a month, one for Parents only to prepare for monthly activity lessons and one for parents and children to grow in community. Sacramental reception years (2nd and 8th grade) have additional Sunday meetings to prepare for receiving First Reconciliation/Holy Communion and Confirmation. The penitential season of Lent is upon us, and we Catholics, like Christians everywhere, begin preparing to commemorate the passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is the forty-day liturgical season of fasting, special prayer and almsgiving in preparation for Easter. The name "Lent" is from the Middle English "Lencten," meaning spring; its more primitive name was the "forty days," "quadragesima" in Latin or "tessaracoste" in Greek. Lent began this year on Ash Wednesday, March 2.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence Observance:

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.
- In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.
- The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
- The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.
- If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Learning About the Mass continued...

The Liturgy of the Eucharist The Lord's Prayer:

After the Consecration and before we receive Holy Communion, we recite the prayer that Jesus taught us, the "Our Father."

The Lord's Prayer or Our Father was taught by Jesus in the gospels of Matthew and Luke and has been used in the Mass throughout the centuries. Just before we say this prayer, we hear the priest say, "At the Savior's command and informed by divine teaching, we dare to say,"

The most striking aspect of the Lord's Prayer is how it leads us to address God as "Father". It was not common for the ancient Jews to address God as "Father". However, Jesus not only was telling us to do this, but he used the word "Abba" which was an affectionate term meaning "Daddy". Jesus was showing all of us how comfortable and close we should feel to God and how much God loves each one of us intimately as His children.

The Our Father is divided into seven petitions. The first three are focused on God and the last four are focused on our needs.

- 1. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.
 - a. We pray that God and his name be recognized and treated as Holy.
- 2. They kingdom come,
 - a. This petition prays that God' reign will be accepted throughout the world in all people's hearts, beginning with our own.
 - b. The Kingdom of God has been coming since the Last Supper and in

the Eucharist it is in our midst. The kingdom will come in glory when Christ hands it over to his Father (CCC2816

- 3. They will be done on earth as it is in heaven
 - a. We are telling God we want His will to be done in our lives. We are saying, just as His will is obeyed perfectly in heaven by all the angels and saints, we pray that all the earth be given the grace to worship Him and obey His will in this same way.


