Sunday of the month at 1:30 pm. Baptisms will not be performed during Lent. An
instructional Infant Baptism Class is required for parents having their child baptized and is
recommended for godparents. For more information and to register for Pre-baptism class,
please call the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Marriage: Common Policy among the Dioceses in New Jersey recommends
preparing for your wedding at least one year in advance. Please contact the Parish Office
for more information.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available every Saturday
from 4:00-4:45 pm in the Reconciliation Room of the Church or by appointment.

Sacrament of the Sick: Please contact the Parish Office if you are homebound and would
like to receive Holy Communion. In the event of an emergency, please call 732-685-1098,
day or night.

Sponsor Eligibility: Godparents/Sponsor eligibility certificates are available for registered
parishioners by calling the Parish Office. Godparents/Sponsors must be practicing
Catholics who have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and, if
married, are in a marriage recognized by the Church.

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Whole Community Catechesis is available for registered parish families with children in Grades 1-8. As the Primary Catechists of
their children, parents are prepared and supported to lead their children in faith at home. Meetings are twice a month, one for
Parents only to prepare for monthly activity lessons and one for parents and children to grow in community. Sacramental

The penitential season of Lent is upon us, and we Catholics, like Christians everywhere, begin preparing to commemorate the passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is the forty-day liturgical season of fasting, special prayer and almsgiving in preparation for Easter. The name "Lent" is from the Middle English "Lencten," meaning spring; its more primitive name was the "forty days," "quadragesima" in Latin or "tessaracoste" in Greek. Lent began this year on Ash Wednesday, March 2.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence Observance:

- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.
- In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.
- The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
- The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.
- If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

- Stations of the Cross in Spanish- 7:45pm

Learning About the Mass continued...

The Liturgy of the Eucharist

The Lord's Prayer continued:

Last week we learned there are seven petitions in the Our Father and how the first three petitions are focused on God. The last four petitions of the Our Father are focused on our needs: Give us this day our daily bread, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, lead us not into temptation and deliver us from evil.

4 – Give us this day our daily bread:

- Daily Bread in this petition is referring to two things.

- * In the Bible, bread is the most basic kind of food and was considered necessary to sustain life. In the Old Testament the Israelites were given exactly enough *manna* or 'bread from heaven' to sustain them each day.

- * This petition also has Eucharistic overtones as the prayer for daily bread points to the Bread of Life we are about to receive in Holy Communion.

5 – Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

- * Before we receive Holy Communion, we are asking God to forgive us our sins, to purify us so that we may be holy tabernacles for Jesus to dwell within us. We are forgiven our venial sins at Mass.

- * Jesus taught us that we will receive God's mercy to the extent that we show mercy to others.

6 – Lead us not into temptation:

- This is a prayer that God will strengthen us to overcome the temptations that we face.

7 – Deliver us from evil:

- In Scripture, the word for "evil" can be translated "the Evil One". This reminds us that evil is not something abstract. It is not random bad things that happen in the world. This petition, evil refers to a being - Satan, the fallen angel who opposes God's will and leads others to join him in his rebellion. In this concluding petition, we are asking that the father protect us from Satan and all his lies and tricks.
